97.1 Planning Applications:-

97.1.1 24/02300/TPO - : Sycamore (T1) - Prune back large overhanging limb by 3-4m in the interest of end branch weight reduction. Crown reduction top the height by up to a maximum of 3m in the interest of decreasing the wind sail. Sycamore (T2) - Remove or pollard to 8-10m from ground level in the interest of safeguarding surrounding structures. Tree root plate is showing evidence of lifting on side of tension. Tree is highly exposed to prevailing wind at Rear of 23 Hughes Lane Malpas

If CWaC Planning Authority is minded to approve the application the Parish Council would request that the following conditions be included:

1/ The Malpas Aecom housing needs survey dated March 2023 says Malpas needs 1,2,3, bedded dwellings and bungalows so should like to see that conditioned.

2/ The Design Codes for Malpas January 2024 which updates the Malpas Character study states that houses along Chester Road are all set back with grass verges and picket fences. The Council would like to see this conditioned as Chester Road is a main gateway to village.

Background Factors: Open countryside

Relevant Malpas and Overton Neighbourhood Plan Policies: LC3 H2, BE1, BE2, LC1 Relevant Local Plan Part 2 Policies: DM3, DM4, DM25, STRAT 9, SOC2, R1, DM19, DM24, DM46, DM48, DM47

Potential impact on wider community: 4 more access points onto an already busy road. Other relevant information: This site is adjacent to the Malpas Conservation area.

100. THE MOSSLAND

Charity Commission:-

There have been an exchange of several emails with the new solicitors Stone King LLP (specialists in Charity Law) regarding the missing trust document for The Mossland. The Clerk has since made several enquires:-

- The Charity Commission has responded to advise that unfortunately, they do not hold any governing document, or associated supporting documents, for this charity on their system. They have suggested that the Council contact the National Archives to check if they hold a copy.
- The National Archives have been contacted and have replied to advise that they do not have the document either. They suggested that the Council contact Cheshire Archives.
- Cheshire Archives too have replied to advise that they do not hold any governing document.

Adrian Waddelove has been removed as a named trustee with the Charity Commission as he is no longer a parish councillor.

101. | SLOW DOWN FOR MALPAS

Cllr Moore updated the meeting regarding recent communication with the PCSO, Threapwood Parish Council and No Mans Heath and District Parish Council regarding Speedwatch and retrieving the speed gun. The person who currently has possession of the speed gun is refusing to return it to the parish councils (the speed gun was purchased jointly by Malpas, Threapwood and No Mans Heath parish councils) therefore the Council agreed to look to get the police involved to retrieve the item.

102. HIGHWAYS

102.1 Speed Limit:-

The Council considered the request to extend the 40MPH on Old Hall Street to past Chorlton Villas.

Resolved:- The Council agreed to the request to extend the 40MPH on Old Hall Street to past Chorlton Villa at a cost of £1,500.00. The Clerk is to confirm this to CWaC.

Proposed by Clir Shackleton and seconded by Clir Moore.

102.2 TRO:-

The Council considered their response to TRO to permit vehicles to only proceed on the following length of road in the direction specified: Oldcastle Lane (Sunnyside to Dog Lane) - north-west to south-east and agreed to write to CWaC to advise they support the TRO.

102.3 Road Signage:-

The Council consider request received from residents to support for a turning sign on Tilston road to highlight the turning to St Joseph's Place. Ward Cllr Williams advised that an assessment is due to be carried out by CWaC regarding the request.

102.4 Village Entrance Signage:-

The Council considered updating the signage entering Malpas and Cllrs are to come back with suggestions.

105.5 Bovis Estate:-

The Council has received concerns regarding the finishing off the estate and getting the road adopted by CWaC.

Ward Cllr Williams advised that the drainage report needs to be signed off by Welsh Water before this can take place.

Concerns were raised regarding the pond at the bottom of the site.

103. | MALPAS JOINT BURIAL COMMITTEE (MJBC)

The Clerk has written to the parish meetings (Chorlton, Cuddington, Wigland, Bradley) to inform them of the situation and suggest that they attend a meeting to discuss sending the proposed letter to MJBC on behalf of all the Parish Council's and Parish meetings.

To date the following responses have been received:-

- 1/ Chorlton no response received to date.
- 2/ Cuddington reply received to advise that the clerk is due to change and the letter has been passed onto the Chair.
- 3/ Wigland An email has been received to advise that both the Clerk and the Chair have resigned with no replacements.

4/ Bradley - no response received to date.

The Council agreed to send proposed letter to MJBC.

104. APPEARANCE OF MALPAS

104.1 Street Furniture:-

The Clerk is in in the process of obtaining quotes.

104.2 Bench outside the Jubilee Hall:-

Cllr Lightning informed the meeting of the details of the proposed replacement bench outside the Jubilee Hall. He is to obtain costings.

The Clerk is to clarify that the cost would be paid s106 funding allocated towards the improvement of the bus stop.

104.3 Village Pump:-

The council agreed to retrieve the pump.

105. MALPAS QR HISTORY TOUR

Ward Cllr Rachel Williams has proposed a new project for the Council in the form of a QR history tour that could support various areas (e.g. tourism, education for school and residents, local business and essentially act as a time capsule of Malpas history for all to discover.)

You Media can make the blue heritage aluminium signs and information boards all with engraved QR codes and can also set up a web site which they can manage.

The idea would be to have a couple of information boards in the village that would inform people of the QR trail. Landmarks / properties would have a sign with some information and a QR code, both would link to a web page that would flag up the history of the location. The web page would also give an opportunity for local residents to input any history that they hold, David Haines has already been informed of the idea and is happy to support with his knowledge. You media would put the information together and manage the page .

You Media has sent various costings for the artwork, signs and website.

The license fee for the framework plus plugin purchase and time would come to £1,000.00 The annual hosting for the website would be £120.00 including SSL certificate and automated daily backups.

Resolved:- The Council agreed to go ahead with the QR Malpas History Tour as detailed above.

Proposed by Cllr Shackleton and seconded by Cllr Lightning.

106. CLAYHOLE CROFT

Work has started to clear the site and should be completed by the end of September. The Council is to contact the neighbouring field to enquire about cutting the height of the hedges to provide better views.

107. ST OSWALDS CHURCH

Concerns were raised regarding the church and the Council considering inviting the Rector to a Council meeting to discuss the issues.

Resolved:- The Council agreed to invite the Rector to a future meeting.

Proposed by Clir Shackleton and seconded by Clir Mason.

108. THE CROSS

The works have now been completed.

The contractor has prepared a report which has been circulated to Cllrs and forwarded to Historic England.

Concerns were raised regarding the lightning conductor as it is non-compliant. A detailed report and quote has been circulated from Cloud to Ground Ltd.

Resolved:- The Council agreed instruct Cloud to Ground Ltd to carry out the necessary works to the lightning conductor at a cost of £1,369.43 plus VAT. Proposed by Cllr Shackleton and seconded by Cllr Lightning.

109. EVENTS COMMITTEE

Cllr Lightning is yet to finalise and then circulate the finances for the village fair.

110. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Ward Cllr Willliams updated the meeting regarding the following arrangements with the local groups regarding the parade for Remembrance Sunday:-

- The Traffic Management has been organised with Core Highways;
- St Oswald's will be doing a service from 10.45 am;
- The Air Cadets are to lead parade;
- It is hoped that Threapwood shop will support again this year with poppy sales;
- Additional street poppies are to be ordered;
- Request for display for the cross with croquet poppies.
